The WAT-2400 Network Camera is referred to as "the camera" in this document.

Important Safety Instructions

When using the camera, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury. Please read all instructions before using

- 1. Read and understand all instructions.
- Keep these instructions.
- 3. Heed all warnings.
- 4. Follow all instructions
- 5. Do not disassemble and/or modify.
- 6. Do not touch with wet hands
- 7. Do not install it near any heat sources.
- 8. The camera is intended for indoor use only.
- 9. Do not expose this camera to rain or moisture.
- 10. Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight may damage the image sensor.
- 11. Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12. Do not touch the camera, the LAN cable, AC adaptor, or AC adaptor cord
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- 13. Unplug the camera when unused for long periods of time.
- 14. Unplug the camera from power outlets if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell or makes unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped and contact the distributor or dealer from which the camera was purchased.
- 15. Make no modifications to the camera or accessories. Unauthorized alterations may compromise safety, regulatory compliance, and system performance.
- 16. Operate this camera within the temperature range of -10°C to 40°C.
- 17. Since the camera may become hot during operation, please provide a sufficient space around the camera for heat dissipation. When you remove the camera, please let time pass for heat dissipation as well.

- In the video to be taken using the camera, which can identify the individual will be personal information. Publication of the video will be necessary to obtain a pre-approval, it will be the responsibility of those who operate the system.
- Because the use at the place of high temperature and humidity adversely affects an internal parts, and life shortens by deterioration, please be careful about use enough. We recommend use less than 30°C.
- · About the damage such as the losses of the data which occurred because of blackouts, we do not take responsibility


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
CAUTION:

- In order to reduce the generation of unnecessary signals, pass the LAN cable through the ferrite core and connect.



Description and Parts



1 Image Sensor

The light receiving face of the image sensor (Dirt, water or oil deposits on the image sensor will cause an unclear picture on the monitor. Attach the lens cap to protect the lens and the sensor from contamination and damage.)

2 Lens Mount

Mount for the lens. (CS-mount)

③ Camera Mounting Features

These mounting features are used to mount the camera. Bolt Size: M3, Depth 4mm. If utilizing a tripod, please attach the supplied tripod adaptor by fixing the 4 bolt locations. There are a total of 4 mounting features encompassing the sides, top and bottom of camera.

- **4** CS Mount Set Screws (Consider using "BACK FOCUS" screws instead) There are 3 adjustable hexagonal screws. Each screw is placed at intervals of 120° around the housing for fine focusing of the lens.
- 5 DC-Iris Socket
- This socket is for the DC auto-iris lens cable connector.

6 Power Input (DC 12V)

Connects to DC 12V power supply system. When you use an attached DC plug, please refer to "Power Supply"

7 Reset Button

Press the reset switch for more than 10 seconds, the restore the camera to the function default settings.

® USB Connector

This connection is for maintenance.

Connect a network cable to this port to communicate with a network or PoE system. The mac address is located on the back of the camera

Power Supply

If in a non-PoE power supply environment, connect the power jack to the DC 12V power supply. A regulated DC 12V 1A power supply is recommended for use with this camera for the most stable operation

CAUTION:

Do not use PoE and DC 12V at the same time!

Use a stabilized power adaptor designed for 12V DC, with a current capacity of more than 1A. Use the optional DC Plug if the shape or polarity of the DC plug of the power adaptor to be used is not compatible with the camera (See the drawing below).

Be careful not to reverse the polarity when you connect the power cable.


If the above care and attention is not adhered to, damage to the WAT-2400 and power adaptor may occur and may also cause fire.

Set-up and Operation

- 1) Please make sure the monitor and camera are turned off when connecting
- 2) Remove the lens mount cap from the WAT-2400 and attach the CS-mount lens. Use the optional C-mount adaptor (30CMA-R) when a C-mount lens is
- 3) Connect the LAN cable to the local network or to the Internet. If you are using a DC power supply, refer to "Power Supply", please be connected to the
- 4) The camera has no main power switch or button. To turn the power on, insert the plug of the power cord into a power outlet. Turn the power on after you have installed the camera.
- 5) Adjust the focus and iris until optimal image clarity through the lens is achieved. If the picture is still out of focus, open the iris fully and loosen 4 CS Mount Set Screws with the hex. wrench and move the lens forwards until a fully focused and clear picture is obtained.

About tripod adaptor

If using the mounting bracket (included), please refer to the figure below and secure the bracket to the camera using the M3x5mm screws (included)

C-mount Adaptor (30CMA-R)

This lens mount adaptor is used to convert a CSmount to a C-mount



AC Adaptor (SWI12-12-N/E-P5)
