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1. Network connection and power activation of the camera

The WAT-933&WAT-2400S (simply called the "camera" from now on if there is no difference in the function "WAT-933" and "WAT-2400S".) have two power supply systems. The one is powered by +12VDC input plug on rear panel of the camera, and the other is powered by the PoE using a LAN connector.

For the WAT-933 with the serial number of W51401050 or earlier, and for the WAT-2400S with the serial number of W51502400 or earlier, please supply power by either the one or the other of the way above and please do not use two power supply methods together.

For the WAT-933, with the serial number of W51401051 or later, and for the WAT-2400S, with the serial number of W51502401 or later, the camera can supply power in two methods above together. When simultaneous power supply is performed, PoE power supply takes priority. If PoE power supply is interrupted, it will automatically switch to DC +12V power supply. After that, it will automatically return to PoE power supply when PoE power supply is restored. The priority in the power supply cannot be changed.

When supplying power with DC + 12 V, use an independent power supply for each camera, and do not share power with other cameras and devices.

The below figure is a connection example of the power supply by the PoE hub. In addition, you need to have the power individually to the router and the PoE hub.



Figure 1. Network configuration example

Connect the LAN cable of camera side to the PoE port of the PoE hub and connect the LAN cable of the router side to a normal LAN port.

If you want to supply power to the camera using the AC power supplies, connect the camera and the router directly with exception of the PoE hub from the above. In a closed network configuration, the DHCP protocol and the router are not required. In that case, connect the PC and the camera directly in LAN cable.

It takes about 6 seconds from the start of power supply until the camera is able to output video.

1.1. Precautions when using microSD card

This camera can use a microSD card.

You can use a microSD card to recording, snapshot, time-lapse, and initialize camera settings.

For details, refer to the pages after "6.6 SD CARD SETUP".

Recommended Operating Conditions

- SDHC / SDXC standard
- MLC type or high durability model
- SD Speed Class CLASS 10 or more
- Capacity of 256GB or less

Note: The exact performance is not guaranteed for all SD cards meeting the requirement described above.

Be sure to perform a format and recognition check with the camera each time you insert a microSD card into this camera.

If you do not operate above, recording may not be performed correctly.

For the format and recognition check procedure, see "1.2. microSD card format" and "1.3. microSD card recognition check".

Note: When using a microSD card with this unit, be sure to insert / remove the card with the power turned off.

1.2. microSD card format

Be sure to format according to the following procedure each time you insert a microSD card into this camera.

Note: Please note that formatting will erase all data on the microSD card.

I. Click "Info" on the WEB setting page to display the SD Card Information page. Click "Format" on the SD Card Information page.

II. Click "OK" in the displayed format confirmation dialog.




Figure 3. Format confirmation dialog

III. Please wait until the status bar reaches 100%.

When it reaches 100%, a restart confirmation dialog will be displayed. Click "OK" to restart.




Figure 4. Status bar display and restart confirmation dialog

1.3. microSD card recognition check

When using a microSD card for recording, be sure to follow the steps below to check that the card is recognized correctly.

- I. Click Info on the WEB setting page to display the SD Card Information page.
- II. Check the Total Size and confirm that it is not 0MB.

If there is an error in the microSD card, it will be displayed as shown by the red underline in the figure below.

If the result of the check shows 0MB, turn off the power, insert and remove the card once, and try formatting again.

1.4. How to initialize the camera setting

You can use the microSD card to initialize the settings.

This initialization method can be used, for example, when you forget the ID / password required to login to the web setting page.

If you can login to the WEB setting page, initialization is possible with "6.2.5.Reset".

If the microSD card you are going to use has never been used with this camera, it will need to be formatted.

Either insert it into the camera and format it, or use a PC or other device to format it in Fat32 format.

The procedures are descrived below.

- I. Connect the microSD card to the PC.
- II. Create a file named "all_reset.bin" directly under the microSD card drive.
 - * Create it as a text file and make sure the file size is 0 bytes.

Make sure to create the file name in all lowercase.

- III. Take out the microSD card from the PC.
- IV. Power off this camera.
- V. Insert the microSD card to this camera.
- VI. Power on this camera.
- VII. Please wait for a while until the camera starts up. It takes about 30 seconds to restart.
- VIII. If the camera is initialized properly, "all_reset.bin" will be deleted from the microSD card. If the camera is not initialized properly, please reconnect the microSD card to your PC and check if "all_reset.bin" has been deleted.

If "all_reset.bin" has not been deleted, please check the file name and file size again.

Note: When the "File name extensions" box in the folder settings is not checked,

you may not be able to change the extension to ".bin".

2. Connection of external MIC. IN

This camera has the MIC. IN function.

You can use the internal MIC. IN attached to the camera, and the external MIC. IN. Refer to "6.4.1.Video" for switching the internal MIC. IN and external MIC. IN. The connection of external MIC. IN is explained below.

2.1. Corresponding terminal of external MIC. IN

When using the external MIC. IN, please use the electret condenser microphone of TRS, TS terminal or line input of RCA terminal.




Figure 7. Corresponding terminal of external MIC. IN.

Below is an example of connection of the input terminal.




Figure 8. Correct connection example

If you connect as shown below, it will cause an accident, so please do not do it absolutely.




Figure 9. Wrong connection example

3. Connection of 4P cable

The wiring diagram of the included 4P cable for power supply / microphone input is as shown in the following figure.




Figure 10. Wiring diagram of 4P cable

Note: Don't short circuit each terminal and the exterior case, otherwise the camera will break down.

(The negative terminal has a different potential from the power supply GND terminal.)

4. Network settings

Before using the camera, you need to configure the network.

The network initial settings and the camera setting examples are described below.

The network settings of this camera can be changed by the Web browser which will be described later.

It is necessary to change the network setting of the PC and the camera according to the situation.

For details on changing the network settings of the camera, refer to "6.5.1.Ethernet" below.

It is possible that the setting has been changed by this camera you used once.

In that case, please contact this camera administrator.

If you do not know the IP address you set, you can reset it to factory default settings. Refer to "1.4. Initialization method of this camera" above.

4.2. Example of PC network settings

Connect this camera and your PC as shown in the below figure. And if the network setting of the camera is in default configuration (IP Address: 192.168.1.250 (static)), go through the following steps to set up the PC network settings.

5. Checking the image from the camera

A case of VLC media player

Download the appropriate VLC which meets your PC from VideoLAN official download page (<u>https://www.videolan.org/vlc/index.html</u>) and install.



Open the VLC media player when the installation is complete. Click on **Media <Open Network Stream** from the menu.




Figure 13. Setting to display video streaming with VLC (No.1)

Paste your copied URL in the 'Network Protocol' box and click "Play". Wait till the video start streaming in your VLC.




Figure 14. Setting to display video streaming with VLC (No.2)

Video starts to stream when the network connections and settings work property. Please check again the network settings if it does not start.




Figure 15. Streaming with VLC

The default username and password are:

Password: "Serial Number" & "Last two digits of MAC address"

Note: For F/W ver.2.0.9 or earlier, the password will be "1234".

Example:

Serial number : W51512345 MAC Address : C4:7C8D:30:AB:CD At this time, the password is "W51512345CD".

Enter the above and click "OK".

The user name and password can be changed on the "6.2.1.User Information" described later.

Note: If the page does not switch even if you input authentication information, check the input characters. If the authentication window does not appear, restart the web browser.

Note: Be sure to change the password, after the first login.

6.1.1. Overview (top page)

Open your web browser and go to the following address page.

This page displays the overview. This page is the top page.

Note: SD CARD SETUP of the menu is displayed only when the microSD card is inserted. If

it is not displayed even though it is already inserted, please refresh the browser (F5).




Figure 17. The Overview page (Top page)

The IP address, MAC address, Serial Number, microSD card capacity, F/W Version, and H.264 Main / H.264 Sub / Jpeg Streaming Link of this camera are displayed. The SD Card Size is displayed only when the microSD card is inserted.

The H.264 Main Streaming Link, H.264 Sub Streaming Link, and Jpeg Streaming Link are hyperlinks.

If the OS uses iOS, Android, Linux, etc. and VLC is installed, VLC will start automatically when you click the link. (Depending on the environment, a dialog for selecting the application to start may be displayed.)

You can also omit the character input by copying the link address and pasting it into the VLC network URL input field as shown in the figure below.

Current ID

Displays the current ID. It cannot be edited. The default setting is "root".

New ID

Enter the ID you want to set.

If blank, no changes are made.

The string that can be set as an ID must be between 4 and 15 characters long and consist of half-width alphanumeric characters and the four symbols (.-_@).

When changing ID, the string you enter in CurrentPassword must match your currently set password.

Also, if you change your ID and password at the same time, the ID will not be changed if there is any error in the password.

Current Password

It is necessary to enter if you would like to change your ID or password. Enter again the current password. If the current password does not match the Current Password, the password will not be changed. Press the ^Omark on the enter field to make the Current Password visible. And, press the ^Mmark to hide the Current Password. The default setting is "Serial Number" & "Last two digits of MAC address". *Please change the password regularly.

*If the F/W is ver.2.0.9 or earlier, the default password is "1234".

New Password

Enter the password you want to change.

If blank, no changes are made.

The string that can be set as an Password must be between 4 and 15 characters long and consist of half-width alphanumeric characters and the four symbols (.-_@).

Press the ^Omark on the enter field to make the New Password visible.

And, press the mark to hide the New Password.

Confirm Password

It is necessary to enter again if you entered a New Password.

Enter again the string you entered in New Password.

If New Password and Confirm Password do not match, the change will not be made.

Press the ^Omark on the enter field to make the Confirm Password visible.

And, press the mark to hide the Confirm Password.

To update the setting value, please click "submit".

Please attention that the authentication window will be displayed again when you change ID or Password.

The ID and Password set here are commonly used for WEB setting page, ONVIF and FTP.

6.2.2. Date & Time

Click "Date & Time" on menu to go to the Date & Time page. Here you can set the time to use in this camera.

SNTP Enable

Use an external SNTP server to switch ON / OFF setting for time acquisition.

When this setting is ON, you can connect to the external SNTP server and synchronize time.

The default setting is "OFF".

SNTP Server

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON.

Enter the IP address or server name of the external SNTP server. You can enter half-width alphanumerical characters and 4 types of symbols (.-_@). The default setting is "time.google.com".

Repetition Period

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON. Set the Repetition Period for synchronization with the SNTP server. It can be set between 10 - 604800. The default setting is "3600".

Retry Time

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON. Set the retry time when connect to the SNTP server fails. It can be set between 1 - 3600. The default setting is "10".

Retry Count

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON. Set the count of retries when connect to SNTP server fails. It can be set between 0 - 60. The default setting is "5".

Time

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is OFF. Set the time of this camera. You can match the client PC time with Get PC time.

Summer Time

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON. Switch ON / OFF used of summer time. The default setting is OFF.

Timezone

It is enabled when SNTP Enable is ON. Select the time zone. The default setting is "(UTC+09:00) Tokyo, Seoul, Ambon, Jayapura, Yakutsk".

Camera Time

The time of the camera is displayed.

Note: When you open this page for a long time, it will gradually deviate from the actual Camera Time.

If you want to see the actual Camera Time, please reopen this page.

PC Time

The time of the client PC is displayed.

UpTime

Displays the elapsed time since startup.

Note: When you open this page for a long time, it will gradually deviate from the actual UpTime.

If you want to see the actual UpTime, please reopen this page.

To update the setting value, please click the "submit" button.

6.2.3. Firmware Update

Click "Update" on menu to go to the Firmware Update page.

Here you can update the camera firmware.

Version Info

Displays the current firmware version.

Firmware Path

Select the firmware file that exists on the client PC.

To update the firmware, select Firmware Path, and click "submit".

When the firmware is correctly transmitted, a progress bar will be displayed.

When the progress bar reaches 100%, the reboot confirmation message will be displayed, so select OK.

Please pay attention that the authentication window will be displayed again when ID or Password has been changed on the "6.2.1.User Information".

Note: We are recommending to use the latest Firmware. The latest Firmware can be downloaded from our website: "https://www.watec.co.jp/download.html". If a downgrade is performed, the system may not be operated properly. Even so, if you would like to downgrade please contact the distributor or dealer from which the camera was purchased.

6.2.4. Save/Load Settings

Click "Save/Load Settings" on menu to go to the Save/Load Settings page.

Here you can save and load the camera setting values.

Example: As shown in Figure below, you can load the configuration file saved from an individual with the same individual or load it with another individual.




Figure 22. Example of using Save / Load Settings

Save Settings

Output the settings of this camera to a file and save it on the client PC.

The settings that can be saved are all settings that can be changed on the WEB setting page.

Click "Save" to save the configuration file (WAT-933_Setting.set or WAT-2400S_Setting.set) on the client PC.

Load Settings

Upload the file that output the settings of this camera from the client PC and load it. Select the setting file (WAT-933_Setting.set or WAT-2400S_Setting.set) saved on the client PC.

To update the setting value, please click "submit".

When loading of the setting file is completed, a confirmation message of restart will be displayed. Please select "OK".




Figure 28. Relationship between AGC and Slow Shutter




Figure 49. ODM screen

When you have not changed, enter Name: root, Password: "Serial Number" & "Last two digits of MAC address".

7.2. FTP Access

You can access internal storage by using FTP. This section explains the connection method of using "FileZilla".

7.2.1. Enable the FTP server

The FTP Server function is off by default. Before making an FTP connection, set the FTP server of "6.5.1. Ethernet" to ON.

Note: When switch ON of FTP server, you need to insert a microSD card. Be sure to turn off the power of the camera before inserting or removing the microSD card.

7.2.2. A case of FileZilla

Download the appropriate Installer which meets your PC from FileZilla official download page (https://filezilla-project.org/) and install it.



Open the FileZilla when the installation is completed.
